Recommendation: Move that the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, authorize the issuance of bonds not to exceed \$799,886 for the purchase of buses as authorized by the voters on May 20, 2008 in accordance with the attached resolution per ASM VI D.

Information:

Bond counsel has indicated that the board must approve of this bond resolution prior to the issuance of bonds for the purpose of financing buses. These bus purchases were authorized by the voters of the Niskayuna Central School District as outlined in proposition number two on May 20, 2008.

The bus bond proceeds allow the district to pay the vendor(s) in full for the buses at the time of delivery. The bus bond proceeds are then repaid over a five year period. These bond payments of principal and interest are "offset" by the transportation aid that the district will receive in each of the next five years for those bus purchases.

BOND RESOLUTION DATED JUNE 16, 2008.

A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT EXCEEDING \$799,886 BONDS OF THE NISKAYUNA CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, SCHENECTADY COUNTY, NEW YORK, TO PAY THE COST OF THE PURCHASE OF NEW SCHOOL BUSES FOR SAID SCHOOL DISTRICT.

WHEREAS, at the Annual Meeting of the qualified voters of the Niskayuna Central School District, Schenectady County, New York, held on May 20, 2008, a proposition was duly adopted authorizing the Board of Education of said School District to purchase new school buses, for a maximum estimated cost of \$799,886, and providing for the levy of a tax therefore to be collected in installments, with obligations of said School District to be issued in anticipation thereof; and

WHEREAS, it is now desired to provide for such purchase of new school buses,
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT

RESOLVED, by the affirmative vote of **not less than two-thirds of the total voting strength** of the Board of Education of the Niskayuna Central School District, Schenectady County, New York, as follows:

Section 1. The purchase of new school buses for Niskayuna Central School District, Schenectady County, New York, including incidental equipment and expenses in connection therewith is hereby authorized at a maximum estimated cost of \$799,886.

Section 2. The plan for the financing of the aforesaid maximum estimated cost shall consist of the issuance of \$799,886 bonds of said School District hereby authorized to be issued therefore pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law. Such bonds are to be payable from amounts which shall annually be levied on all the taxable real property in said School District, and the faith and credit of said Niskayuna

Central School District, Schenectady County, New York, are hereby pledged for the payment of said bonds and the interest thereon.

Section 3. It is hereby determined that the period of probable usefulness of the aforesaid class of objects or purposes is five years, pursuant to subdivision 29 of paragraph a of Section 11.00 of the Local Finance Law.

Section 4. Subject to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, the power to authorize the issuance of and to sell bond anticipation notes in anticipation of the issuance and sale of the serial bonds herein authorized, including renewals of such notes, is hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer. Such notes shall be of such terms, form and contents, and shall be sold in such manner, as may be prescribed by said President of the Board of Education, consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 5. All other matters except as provided herein relating to the serial bonds herein authorized including the date, denominations, maturities and interest payment dates, within the limitations prescribed herein and the manner of execution of the same, including the consolidation with other issues, and also the ability to issue serial bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, shall be determined by the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of such School District. Such bonds shall contain substantially the recital of validity clause provided for in Section 52.00 of the Local Finance Law, and shall otherwise be in such form and contain such recitals, in addition to those required by Section 51.00 of the Local Finance Law, as the President of the Board of Education shall determine consistent with the provisions of the Local Finance Law.

Section 6. The validity of such bonds and bond anticipation notes may be contested only if:

- a) Such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which said School District is not authorized to expend money, or
- b) The provisions of law which should be complied with as of the date of publication of this resolution are not substantially complied with,

and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or

- c) Such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the Constitution.

Section 7. This resolution shall constitute a statement of official intent for purposes of Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2. Other than as specified in this resolution, no monies are, or are reasonably expected to be, reserved, allocated on a long-term basis, or otherwise set aside with respect to the permanent funding of the object or purpose described herein.

Section 8. This resolution, which takes effect immediately, shall be published in full or summary form in the Daily Gazette, which is hereby designated as the official newspaper of said School District for such purpose, together with a notice of the School District Clerk substantially in the form provided in Section 81.00 of the Local Finance Law.
