Re: Summer 2011 Curriculum Proposals

Motion: That the Board of Education, upon the recommendation of the Superintendent of Schools, approve the attached list of Summer 2011 curriculum projects recommended for funding.

Information: With the addition of full day kindergarten, curriculum planning was promised to our classroom teachers. In addition, both music and art teachers will need to revise their respective curricula.

In order to move forward with Common Core Math Standards and common assessments, we are inviting teachers in grades four and five to work with Bill Wales and consultant, Kathy Meron. Their work will include construction of a pacing guide and preliminary construction of common assessments.

The Art Department is transitioning to digital photography and is interested in providing time for teachers to collaborate on the use of the newly purchased cameras for this purpose.

This year, it was discovered that students who took DDP with the goal of receiving art credit, may find this credit is in jeopardy because there was an understanding from Project Lead the Way that DDP would fulfill similar requirements. A crosswalk is needed between both courses to ensure fidelity to both the art and DDP curricula.

Three of our social studies teachers wish to restructure classes based upon the voiced needs of our students. This will require collaborative time to re-organize instructional content so that concepts can be taught together absent the artificial construct of two independent semester courses.

For our special education teachers to be in equal partnership with our regular education teachers, it is important for them to study the taught curriculum on Rubicon and provide differentiation strategies and accommodations for our students.

Finally, the Office of Student Support Service intends to offer co-teaching planning this summer. They have budgeted funds not to exceed \$5,000.
